
Year of Service

The National Order of the Arrow Committee has declared 1995 as "The year of service." The committee plans to focus all of its service efforts toward the revitalization of Philmont Scout Ranch in the same way local lodges focus on service to the local camp.

Trips to Philmont to participate in the service projects for 1995 will last 14 days each.

The remaining days will be spent hiking Philmont's splendid back country with your crew. You must be at least 16 years old by the date your program begins, but not 21 by its conclusion. All applicants must be physically capable of the strenuous labor involved. There are nine different crew dates from June 13 through August 22.

A Philmont Retreat has also been planned for this summer. The purpose of the Retreat is similar to that of a NOAC. Training sessions will be offered on such topics as Organizing American Indian Events, Ceremonial Events, Quality Program Development, and Showmanship. Each lodge is allowed eleven slots (8 youth & 3 adults) with a required \$50 deposit.


- *All delegates must provide their own tents.

- *There will be a judges meeting on Friday April 21, 1995 at 11:00pm and the location will be announced at registration on Friday.



Membership Fee Increase Approved

The National Order of the Arrow Committee, at its December 18, 1994 meeting, approved a motion to raise the Order's annual membership fee to \$1.50. The new change will go into effect during the 1996 rechartering period. This is a 50 cent increase. Lodges should plan appropriately when building their operating budgets for next year.

Year of Service Award

Lodges conducting service projects during the 1995 Year of Service will be presented a certificate of recognition for their efforts. The service project must be approved by the Scout Executive to qualify.

In addition, qualifying lodges will be eligible to purchase a Year of Service patch for participating lodge members. Details on ordering the certificate and patch will be detailed in the spring issue of the National Bulletin.
