For the past several years, our lodge has struggled with providing timely, informative and frequent communication. After strengthening our email system, the lodge leadership looked to new forms of communication. We created a lodge wide text message service that worked very well, updates to our website, and calling other brothers to discuss upcoming events and other information.

We began conducting formal elangomat training several months before an Ordeal. We started having more time for games in the afternoon and started having special activities in the evening for all the candidates to enjoy, like a root beer float night and other activities. We started to have a committee fair in the evenings on Saturday after dinner for all the new members to get involved in all the activities Tsali does.

We also improved program. Through offering special activities as each event and increased communication, we were able to increase our event registration by an average of 17% since last year and a total increase of 82% since 2014. 


