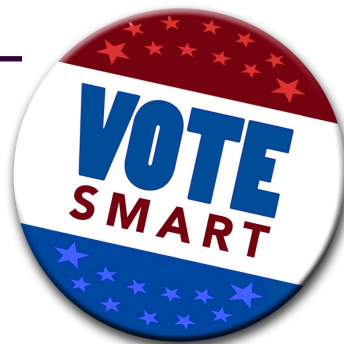

### Candidates for Section Chief

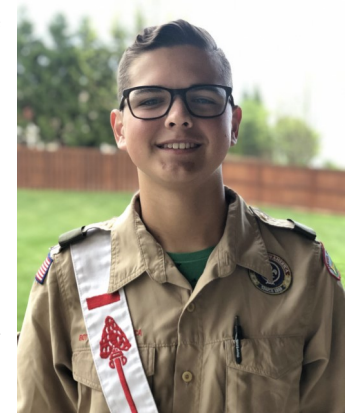
## Candidates for Section Vice Chief

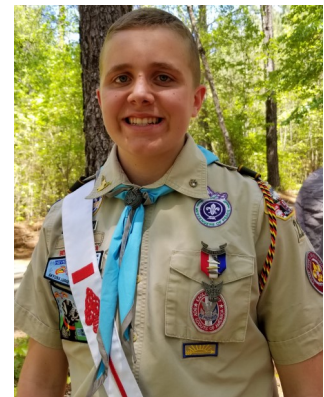
I think it would be an understatement to say that I could make a difference in this section, as I believe I'm very prepared for this position and see this position as a great experience.

## Vehicle Information for Check-out

The following notes regarding vehicles and check-out for tomorrow are provided by the Service Lodge . . .

- Shuttles to the parking lot leave from the gate to camp starting at 6:10 AM on Sunday.
- Shuttles to and from the parking area will continue to run throughout the morning
- DO NOT park your vehicle in main camp and then go attend the show. If you want to see the show, you can load your vehicle and move it back to long term parking and catch the shuttle back to main camp, or you can wait until after the show to load your gear
- When you get your vehicles from the parking lot you must drive directly to your campsite and load your gear and get the vehicle out of main camp as soon as possible
- DO NOT park on the side of the road at any point on Sunday. You will be blocking your own people from leaving and will be instructed to move.
